



# Oregon Spends \$1 billion annually on Prescription Drugs

We are working to reduce those costs by signing people up for the new Oregon Prescription Drug Program (OPDP). The OPDP will combine the purchasing power of state agencies, local governments and low-income seniors to negotiate lower prescription prices. Similar programs in other states have resulted in up to 60% discounts on prescription prices.

Oregonians, 54 and older, with an annual income of less than \$17,224 for individuals or \$23,107 for couples are eligible to participate. Enrollment forms for the new prescription program will be available this fall. Please fill out the form below to receive more information and an enrollment form.
